



Attendee Cancellation Policy

If you are subject to documented travel restrictions imposed by governing bodies with proper jurisdiction over your home municipality that would prevent you from travelling to Orlando, Florida on March 11, 2021, you will receive the option for your registration fee to be refunded or applied to a future SEVillage, LLC conference or event.

If circumstances change and you can no longer attend the Human Hacking Conference 2021, you may cancel your registration in accordance with the cancellation policy described below by providing written notice via email to contact@humanhackingconference.com. Registrations may be refunded if cancellation is made in writing to contact@humanhackingconference.com on or before the cancellation cutoff date – January 11, 2021. No refunds will be provided to any person who does not attend or requests cancellation after January 11, 2021.
